Team










Challenges

- Low engagement
- Team members less comfortable to contribute
- Time consuming
- Accommodation of remote team members
- Amplified in large teams





Trialed Approach – Wondering Walk









Addressing Challenges

- Challenge
 - Team buy in

- 1 Implemented Solutions
 - Pre workshop messaging
 - Early and frequent

Addressing Challenges



Challenges

- Consistent capture / facilitation
- Risk of duplicated risks
- Split risk categories



Implemented Solutions

- Set clear objectives
- Group risk categories by anticipated risks
- Facilitator selection
- Pre meetings for facilitation and risk capture
- Facilitator prevents duplication within categories
- Post workshop clean up















Addressing Challenges



Challenge

- Appropriate venue
- Technology limitations



Implemented Solutions

- Separate rooms for every group (in person)
 - Pre workshop materials (maps)
- Room online capacity(hybrid/online)
 - MS Teams

 - Discipline vs cross discipline
- Full group intro and reconvene
- Post workshop clean up meetings


