

# Transportation & Economic Corridors

## 2023 Partnering Award Application

### Background

The Transportation and Economic Corridors Partnering Award is an annual recognition program of completed contracts that best promotes, adheres to, and optimizes the principles of partnering. The main focus is to celebrate success, share lessons learnt, and honour all parties' participation in the partnering process.

### Eligibility

1. All Alberta Transportation Design-Bid-Build contracts, where Alberta Transportation is the owner and awarded the construction contract to a contractor, with a consultant being the representative for Alberta Transportation in managing the contract, are eligible to apply.  
AND
2. All construction projects completed within the 2022 calendar year are eligible to apply. AND
3. Contracts between Highway Maintenance Contactor and Transportation and Economic Corridors are eligible to submit an application. This category will not require a consultant to be involved. Maintenance will be judged as a separate category. AND
4. A particular project may only apply once.

### Criteria and Instructions

1. All application forms must be jointly completed and signed by all parties.
2. A group of judges, representing each of the three parties, will be reviewing the applications.
3. Application forms are divided into objective
4. Projects will be separated into three categories based on the partnering risk level as determined by the Project Risk Indicator (completed by Transportation and Economic Corridor staff before tender advertising). If there is less than three applications in any of the three categories in any given year, the applications may be carry forward to the next year and combine with the applications from the following year.
5. All applications shall complete the Questions in all Sections.

6. The application in each category receiving the highest score will be award the 2023 Partnering Award and prize.
7. Scores will be assessed by the judges with the following in mind: establishment, measurement and achievement of project goal; value expectation improved by Partnering; issue resolution and team based problem solving; project completion on time on budget; management of relationships; lessons learnt.
8. All applications shall be submitted by Jan 23, 2023.
9. The winners will be announced at the 2023 CEA Transportation Conference, along with the 2023 Minister's Awards for Transportation Innovation.

11. The applicant may remove any proprietary information (etc. pricing) from any required supplemental information before submitting.
12. The judges may contact the applicants to obtain more information or seek clarification.

5. How effective is the application of the issue resolution ladder on this project?
6. Please provide an example of a challenge on the project and how it was resolved through the application of principles of Partnering.
7. Identify any innovative ideas that evolved through the project Partnering process.
8. How did Partnering improve relationships between the Alberta Transportation, the Consultant and the Contractor during and after the project?
9. How did Partnering allow the project team to improve the project's benefit (time, quality, cost, etc.) beyond what was specified in the Contract?

10. Any suggestions on how Partnering on Alberta Transportation projects can be improved?
